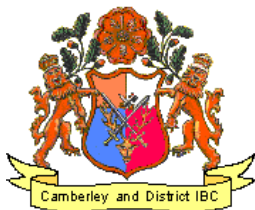

Now available - New functions for **members only** - you will first need to register on the system to set a password. After that you may login and use the system to book provisional rinks (and confirm them) for competitions from the comfort of your own homes.

The system also allows you to apply for club matches, and tick off selections made for the matches, instead of having to come in and update the paper copies in the club foyer

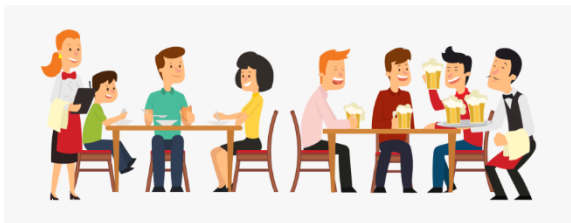

GENERAL INFORMATION

Car Parking

When parking at the club, please park in an orderly fashion in a marked space only, and do not obstruct the entrance, access or exit routes of other vehicles.

In particular, please be careful not to obstruct the emergency vehicle access to the left of the club entrance. Would you also please respect the spaces marked for disabled parking and bar staff. Your co-operation will be greatly appreciated.

No liability is accepted by Surrey Heath Bowling Ltd for damage to any vehicle or its contents.

The Council have designated the car park as '5-hour parking' only. This removes the problem of cars being parked in it on a long-term basis, and thus makes more spaces available for short-term parking. We have agreed with the council that we may issue passes for members and visitors who may **need to exceed the 5-hour limit**, or for those who may need to visit the club **two or more times** in a single day. Passes may be obtained from reception and are colour-coded and dated for the day of issue. They are not re-usable on subsequent days: a new pass must be obtained.

Ensure that your vehicle is parked within a marked space only. Surrey Heath Borough Council Car Wardens do patrol this car park regularly, and will issue **Penalty Notices** for any transgression of regulations.

Premises

Members shall not alter any of the controls of lighting, heating or ventilation. Should there be any problems please contact the Management Secretary.

Fire Precautions

The first concern in the event of fire on the club premises is the safety of occupants. All other considerations are secondary to this.

There are a number of fire action notices displayed at various locations within the club. Please take time to read them and familiarise yourselves with the procedures to be taken in the unlikely event of an outbreak of fire on the premises.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Please do **not** open the fire exits unless there is a genuine emergency. The exits are all alarmed and opening them could cause the alarms to trigger. In addition, leaves and other foreign objects could be blown in from outside, and cause damage to the surface of the green.

Child Protection Policy

The Camberley and District Indoor Bowling Club fully accepts its legal and moral obligations to exercise its duty of care and to protect all children and vulnerable adults participating in its activities and to safeguard their welfare.

The Child Protection Officer for this club is Peter Wright,

Security Of Personal Belongings

Members and visitors are reminded that the security of personal belongings is their own responsibility. Surrey Heath Bowling Limited will not be held liable for loss or damage to personal belongings on club premises. Please do not leave valuables in the changing rooms.

Lost Property

Anyone finding lost property on the club premises is requested to place it in the lost property cupboard situated just outside the Committee Room, unless it is particularly valuable, such as jewellery, money etc. Such items should be deposited in the Management Office, or handed to a member of the Management or Bowling committees at the earliest opportunity.

Smoking

In accordance with the law, smoking is not permitted anywhere within the club premises. **This includes the use of electronic cigarettes or any form of vaping device.**

Would all smokers please use the over-shoes provided at the entrance door, should they go outside in bowling shoes, and replace after use. Please do not leave door on latch if going outside to smoke – take entry card with you.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones may be used within the club in the lounge and restaurant areas, but they must not be used at green level.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Notices

No paper, placard or poster, written or printed, shall be displayed in the club without the permission of the Management Secretary.

Correspondence

There are a number of pigeon holes (lettered A – Z) located in the entrance hall, where members may leave correspondence for other members.

Rink Bookings

Rinks may not be booked, or used for rollups, for sessions in which a General Meeting of the Company or Club is taking place.

Changing Room Lockers

There are a limited number of lockers for members' use within each of the changing rooms. These are allocated, as they become available, on payment of a one-off fee (£12). Further details may be obtained from Pam Lawrence, and application forms are available within the changing rooms. If a locker is no longer required, please surrender key to Pam – do not pass on to another person; otherwise it becomes impossible to keep accurate details of locker allocation.

Personal belongings must **NOT** be stored on top of locker units.

There are shelves available in each changing room for storage of personal items during the day only. Items may be stored on them for short periods on odd occasions, but **they must not be used for permanent storage of bowls bags etc.**

Care of the Green

Please help to take care of the green - **no running allowed**. Members are also reminded that no food, **of any kind**, may be taken onto the green or its surrounds. **This includes crisps, sweets, chocolates, etc.**

Accident Book

Members are asked to note that an Accident Book is provided behind the Reception Desk. A sheet in the book should be completed after any accident occurring on club premises, however small. It may be completed by anyone, but the names of both the person(s) suffering the accident and the person reporting it should be recorded. In order to comply with the Data Protection Act, the

completed sheet must be removed from the book as soon as it has been completed, and then handed into the Management Office. If the office is closed, the sheet may be pushed under the door.

Defibrillator

The Club has installed a life-saving defibrillator, which is situated on the wall at the entrance to the green. This is a fully automatic model, and will guide users through its operation, and only deliver a shock if necessary. It is designed to be used by anyone. See instructions in the table top guides on the tables in the lounge.

Visitors Book

The names of all visitors to the club, whether guests of members or casual visitors, must be entered in the Visitors Book (located at the Reception Desk) either by the introducing member, or the Green Steward on duty at the time.

Members Details

Members are requested to inform the Membership Secretary, in writing of any change to their address or telephone number details. There is a Members' Telephone List situated at the Reception Desk. A number of local telephone directories are also available from the shelf near the Payphone in the Entrance Hall .

Bar and Catering Facilities

Bar and catering facilities are available at the times advertised within the club.

Please help to keep the club tidy by returning glasses, plates, cutlery etc. to the bar or servery.

Green Stewards

All league teams are expected to act as Green Steward on a rota basis, as detailed on the league playing schedules published by the League Secretary.

Daytime leagues are now covered by a team of volunteers: new helpers are always welcome; if you are interested please contact a member of the management committee.

The duties are:

- Retrieve Cash Box, check that float in box is correct, check that all keys are in place.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Retrieve league scorecards from cupboard behind reception desk.
- Collect rink fees, and enter amounts on day sheet plus any competition fees due (all fees on desk notice). *Note that the full green fee for a team game is payable, even if more members of a team are absent.*

In the event of a 'no-show' by a team, write in the notes section on the day sheet the details of the team(s) that failed to arrive for the match, together with the names of the team members that did arrive. In addition, advise the players that the Team Captains must complete and return a 'Postponed League Match' form (available from the box containing blank Additional Players Registration forms) and return it to the League Secretary within 5 days.

- Fees for roll-ups (except 'pre-season' sessions) must be placed by player(s) within brown envelopes provided, and placed in red cash box on top of Reception Desk. 'Pre-season' roll-up fees are collected as for leagues and competitions (Roll-up register must still be completed).
- Complete day sheet, have it checked and countersigned, put tear-off slip and monies collected in tube and place in safe (located by green entrance slope).
- Evening Stewards: before leaving, ensure that float (in Cash Box) is correct and then locked in desk drawer.
- Answer calls, both telephone and at the door, as required. Please note business calls and deliveries on the pad provided, and, if possible, leave a copy of a telephone message for the person concerned. A pad for telephone messages is situated by the telephone.
- Issue Car Parking passes as necessary to members and guests. Note: passes are usable on day of issue only and do not need to be returned.
- Be aware of the position of all forms required and take details of potential new members, and/or any coaching information required.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- In the absence of any club directors (list on reception desk) the green steward is in charge of the club, so needs to be aware of the position of all fire exits and extinguishers, and the position of the first aid box, for use in an emergency. Note any accidents in the book provided.
- Please ensure that **all** visitors/guests to the club sign the visitor's book on the reception desk.
- Please make notes of any reported problems in the club, for action by the management.
- Open car park barrier for visiting Match Coaches, deliveries or waste collection drivers, and secure afterwards.

Club 'Fun Drives'

The Club runs a number of 'fun drives' during the season (mostly on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons where there is no friendly match at home, and on Sunday evenings). The purpose of the drives are to encourage new bowlers and to provide bowling for those members who on the odd occasion have not been selected for an away match. The format is very relaxed and friendly and provides an ideal opportunity for all bowlers to have a good afternoon with friends and to meet our new members who may have not yet plucked up enough courage to put their names down for matches.

On Tuesdays and Wednesdays please arrive for these drives by 1:45pm for registration in order that a timely start may be made at 2:15pm. On Sundays please arrive by 6pm, so that a start may be made at 6:30pm.

Roll-Ups

Once the season has started (i.e. after the pre-season roll-up sessions) members wishing to 'roll-up' must register, **PRIOR** to commencing play, by

- a) completing the roll-up register, and
- b) entering the required details onto one of the brown envelopes available at Reception, and
- c) enclosing the correct green fee in this envelope and then depositing it in the red HONESTY box on the desk.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Any members and/or guests will be asked to leave the green if they are found not to have followed this procedure.

Members may also use the green for a roll-up on Weekday mornings from 8:30 am until the morning leagues start – these sessions are FREE, but members are still required to complete the roll-up register as above. This is to enable some analysis on rink usage to be carried out.

Any rink not pre-booked for other purposes may be used for a roll-up. Please refer to the Green Steward's Rink Book for availability. Rinks must always be available for up to 8 players.

Rinks may be pre-booked for roll-ups if there is availability, and paid for on the day of play (following the procedure outlined above). However requirements for other official fixtures, e.g. leagues, competitions, coaching etc., will take precedence over casual bowls. Any member not fulfilling the booking will be required to pay the full green fees. Rinks must always be available for up to 8 players. Members wishing to restrict the number of players to a lesser number must pay full green fee per hour as though 8 players were present.

Members may invite guests to have a roll-up, but must complete the Visitor's Book (at Reception), and accept responsibility for their guest(s) behaviour whilst on club premises.

Summer Bowling

The club is open for Bowling throughout the Summer on Monday, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, from May to August.

A Club Drive is held on a Wednesday afternoon.

New players are always welcome so if you do not belong to an outdoor club or would like to enjoy a relaxed few hours playing bowls then come and join us.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Towards the end of the winter season, a registration book will be on the reception desk for individual players who would like to join an existing team and for those who wish to form their own team for one or more of the leagues.

A few friendly matches with other clubs will be held in the summer. Please keep an eye out for the availability sheets that will be put up in the lobby.

Teams are likely to be selected a week or two before the date of the match so do please be alert to that and tick off your name to confirm your selection. New bowlers will be most welcome.

Generally the matches will be triples and the dress will be greys. The availability sheets will show this. The afternoon will generally include tea and cakes or sandwiches. For the away matches it is usual for players to meet up at our club and share cars. These are great events to get to know other CDIBC players as well as players from other clubs and generally have an enjoyable afternoon with no pressure or stress.

We look forward to seeing you during the Summer Months.

NOTES ON BOWLING ETIQUETTE

Notes On Bowling Etiquette

The Club's aim is to provide a playing environment which is friendly, competitive and enjoyed by all. This list, which is by no means exhaustive, is a guide to good conduct on the green.

Remember bowling is a friendly game and all players should show courtesy and good sportsmanship. Shake hands before a match and at its conclusion. Be gracious whether you win or lose and compliment your opponent on a good shot.

Never criticise your opponents, the green or your own team. If you cannot say something positive say nothing.

Encourage and praise the rest of your team. Bowls is a team game and everyone should be working together.



Don't applaud a team member who has outrageous luck and admit a fluke with grace. Refrain from talking opponent's woods out of the head or ill-wishing an opponent's bowl (think it if you must, but never say it out loud).

Avoid dropping bowls onto the green - this can damage the playing surface.



Do not start 'breaking up the head' until the score for the end has been agreed.

Remember it's only **one** person's job to agree the score with his or her opposite number – rest of the team should stand well back.

Firing! – if you are about to deliver a 'heavy' wood, please ensure that the teams at the head on both your rink and adjacent rinks are aware so that they can take appropriate action to prevent injury to themselves and/or damage to the heads on on other rinks.



At the mat end, when not occupying the mat, players should stand at least a metre behind the mat, being careful not to distract the

player about to bowl, by moving about or talking. When you have delivered your bowl and it has come to rest the possession of the mat passes to your opponent, so move away quickly.

When you are behind the head, stand still and do not stand where you obscure the boundary or rink markers.

When might changing ends, players should walk *briskly* down the **centre of the rink** (but don't run). In a league game, skips should leave the head together and, to avoid interfering with play on an adjacent rink, should not stop and speak to their teams half way down the rink.

Please do not walk behind a rink (i.e. on the Green's external surrounds) when a bowler on that rink is about to bowl.

Mobile Phones must be switched off if taken on the green or surrounds.

Eating, drinking or carrying drinks on the green or surrounds is not allowed.

Footwear - Only bowling shoes may be worn on the green. Do not wear bowling shoes anywhere outside the Club - they could transfer dirt or grit on to the bowling surface when returning to the green.

Learn the Rules of the Sport of Indoor Bowls and Club Bye-Laws and observe them.

Using foul and or abusive language on the green is contrary to the laws and spirit of the game. Please remember good etiquette and manners make for a pleasant game and cost nothing. If someone else makes a mistake, don't react badly – have a quiet word politely!

Misconduct

Allegations of misconduct on the green should be made in writing to the Bowling Committee who will consider if there is a case for a member to answer. The Committee will make known its findings to the relevant parties and if necessary include these in the minutes of the meeting.

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

**** Please Note ****

There have been some changes made to the bye-laws for this season, see sections A6, C1, C5, C6 and C7 (changes have been identified by being printed in ***bold italic*** text, and the paragraphs in which they appear are marked by a vertical bar to the left.

A1 Laws of the Game

The Laws of the Sport of Indoor Bowls and the E.I.B.A. Ltd National Championship Rules shall apply in all circumstances not covered by these Bye Laws.

A2 Organisation

These Bye Laws apply to the Camberley and District Indoor Bowling Club (hereafter referred to as the “Club” or “CDIBC”).

The Competition Secretary shall be responsible for the administration of the Club’s Internal Competitions and shall be accountable to the Bowling Committee.

The League Secretary shall be responsible for the administration of the Club’s League Programme and shall be accountable to the Bowling Committee.

A3 Rink Behaviour

RUNNING on the green is strictly prohibited.

Use of ‘grippo’, ‘glycerine’, ‘rosewater’, ‘non water-based chalk puffers’ or similar items are not allowed.

No food, of any kind, is to be taken past the stairways onto the green surrounds.

Members must not conduct themselves on or off the green in a manner likely to cause damage to the club's high reputation.

A4 Dress

For Club Matches:

- CDIBC Shirts
- Coloured waistcoats/cardigans (Ladies only – optional)

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

- For matches specified as whites - white tailored trousers or shorts, or for Ladies only, white skirts, cropped trousers or culottes – white socks (Men only)
- For matches specified as greys - grey tailored trousers or shorts, or for Ladies only, grey skirts, cropped trousers or culottes
- A member failing to wear a CDIBC Shirt for a club match may render themselves ineligible for selection for future club matches until a shirt is secured.

For Competition Semi-Finals and Finals:

- White, white with coloured piping, E.I.B.A registered coloured bowls manufacturer or customised coloured bowls shirt with collar and sleeves, Club tie (Men only – optional); CDIBC Shirts are also permitted.
- Club coloured waistcoats/cardigans (Ladies only – optional)
- White tailored trousers or shorts or, for Ladies only, white skirts / culottes / cropped trousers – white socks (men only):

For Roll-ups, leagues, competitions, etc.:

- White, white with coloured piping, E.I.B.A registered coloured bowls manufacturer or customised coloured bowls shirt with collar and sleeves, CDIBC Shirts are also permitted
- Club coloured waistcoats/cardigans (ladies only) – optional
- Grey tailored trousers or shorts or, for Ladies only, grey skirts / culottes / cropped trousers

In addition to the items detailed above, white jumpers and white fleeces are also permitted.

Headgear in the form of caps or visors may be worn provided the fabric is predominantly white. Tinted visors may also be worn.

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

For competitions, team members must wear matching shirts.

REGULATION BOWLS SHOES must be worn at all times whilst on the green.

(Note: the club's dress code is relaxed for coaching school pupils under instruction, whereby smart, casual clothing may be worn during the training sessions (regulation bowls shoes are still required). This also applies to novice bowlers having 'roll-up' sessions and is intended to encourage new bowlers to participate more fully in the game in their initial few weeks in the club, perhaps whilst deciding whether the game is for them or not!)

A5 Cost of Rinks

Cost of rinks will be as determined by the Management Committee from time to time, and will be displayed at the Reception Desk.

A6 Rink Booking Procedures

Note: This bye-law refers to the manual method of booking rinks, which is being superseded by use of an electronic booking system at the beginning of this season 2019-20. However, same basic provisions will apply, although bookings are actually made via computer system.

ALL RINK BOOKINGS must be made, provisionally, on the relevant rink booking sheet held in the book at the Reception Desk. Note: 2 dates only may be provisionally booked for an External Competition.

When the date/time booked for a game has been accepted by, or otherwise agreed with, the opponent(s), the 'date confirmed' should be entered on the relevant rink booking sheet, and all other provisional bookings for the same game crossed out.

Confirmed bookings will be transferred to the Rink Diary, after a check that they do not conflict with other matches already confirmed. **Only Bowling Committee Members, or persons authorised by the Bowling Committee, may make**

transfers of confirmed bookings to the Rink Diary.

Provisional bookings will be held open for a maximum of 3 days awaiting confirmation by opponent, after which they will be cancelled, and the session time made available for others. A single (2 hour) session only may be booked for club competition singles, open two wood pairs, and novice pairs - the match may commence early if booked for 10.00am, subject to prior arrangement to allow for earlier opening of the club, or overrun if booked for the last evening session midweek, or where the following session has not previously been booked for another match.

A league game may not be moved to an alternative rink in favour of an internal club competition, except, in the circumstances set out below, to enable a four-hour club competition game access to a rink for a double session.

1. Where a two-hour league game is scheduled on a rink having the previous or following sessions vacant that game will, if required, move to another available rink in the same session to enable a four-hour club competition game to take place. If no other rink is available, the league may not be moved.
2. A league game shall not be moved under this rule where any other rink has both sessions free in the same four-hour period.
3. When under this rule a competition game is entered in the rink session sheets the captains of the moved league teams shall be notified of the change of rinks as soon as this is confirmed and may rearrange their game.

This arrangement will apply to all rounds up to the *semi-finals*.

A league game may be moved to an alternative rink in favour of an external (national, county, etc.) competition, subject to meeting provisions of sub-paragraph 3 above.

Rinks may only be booked for a 'roll-up' where the number of players is a minimum of 8 people – the person booking the rink will be responsible for the collection, and payment to the club, of the appropriate rink fees.

If a confirmed rink booking is not taken up, the member booking the rink will be charged the full rink fee, which would have been chargeable for the match, unless the booking was cancelled in advance, and noted in the Rink Diary.

A7 National, County, other External Competition Bookings

Within the season, rinks are left free during midweek league sessions (day and evening) primarily for use by competitors in national, county and other external competitions.

League sessions or Internal Club Competitions may only be postponed in favour of an external competition as a last resort, and then only with permission from the League (or Competition) Secretary, subject to no other day being possible, and no other rink being available, unless exceptional circumstances (as determined by the relevant Secretary) apply.

Competitors may not approach league or competition team captains before the relevant Secretary has agreed postponement. Following agreement of postponement, at least 3 days notice must be given, by the person booking the rink, to the captains of the league or competition teams concerned.

League and/or Internal Club Competition matches may be postponed in favour of Club Matches or National, County or other External Competition semi-finals, area finals, and/or finals, at the discretion of the League or Competition Secretary.

Under no circumstances will rinks, which have been booked and confirmed for matches involving visiting competitors, be cancelled and taken for other matches.

Matches scheduled to be played away must NOT be played at home, unless a free rink can be found - rinks booked for other purposes may not be cancelled, under any circumstances, to accommodate these matches.

A8 Contravention of Bye-Laws

Members contravening these bye-laws, or those for leagues or competitions, where no specific penalty is laid down, will be verbally warned by a member of the Bowling Committee in

the first instance. Further contravention will result in a written caution. Any subsequent transgression may lead to suspension (or possible expulsion).

Any disputes between league teams or competitors as to the interpretation of the bye laws should be referred to the League or Competition Secretary concerned who shall consider the facts of the case and arrive at a decision.

In certain circumstances the relevant secretary may refer the case to the Bowling Committee, who will appoint a Sub-Committee (of 3 members) to adjudicate on the matter. The member(s) in dispute have the right to present their case(s) personally before the Sub-Committee, before a decision is reached, which may include action(s) not elsewhere laid down.

Members are reminded that no set of rules can cater for every situation, and that unusual incidents not specifically provided for in either these bye-laws or the laws of the game may occur. The Bowling Committee will always endeavour to apply commonsense to resolve any such problems.

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

B1 Eligibility

All League Bowlers shall be playing members of the Club, whose club subscriptions are up-to-date.

B2 Registration

One member of each league team shall be appointed as the team's captain. Prior to the start of each league season the League Secretary will send a League Team Registration Form to the captain of each league team that has been previously registered.

The captain shall be responsible for the registration of the league team by returning a completed League Team Registration Form, together with appropriate fees, to the League Secretary on or before the closing date stipulated on the form. A team shall not be permitted to play an unregistered player, or a player currently registered with another team in the same league (or another division of the same league). Any team playing an unregistered player(s) shall have 2 points deducted from their league total in respect of each match concerned.

Team captains may register additional players or de-register members that have resigned from their team at any time during the season, using the Additional League Players Registration Form available from the League Secretary's registration form box (situated by the ramp entrance to the green). Registrations of new players will not be considered unless submitted on the correct form. A player resigning from a team will not be eligible for re-registration in the same league (or another division of the same league) in the same season.

- Pairs: each team shall register a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 6 players.
- Triples: each team shall register a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8 players.
- Fours: each team shall register a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 10 players.

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

B3 Application of New Team

Any team wishing to enter a league in the following season should enter the contact details for their team captain on the appropriate League Programme Sign-up Sheet. These sheets are located in the League Programme Sign-up Sheet folder that is normally available on the Reception desk towards the end of the Winter League season.

Any team wishing to enter a league in the current season should contact the League Secretary at the earliest opportunity.

The League Secretary may, at his discretion, refuse a request to enter a new team in a league in circumstances where this would be impractical.

The League Secretary will send a League Team Registration Form to the captain of each new league team.

The captain shall be responsible for the registration of the league team by returning a completed League Team Registration Form, together with appropriate fees, to the League Secretary on or before the closing date stipulated on the form.

B4 Time of Play

All league matches must be played on the day and time allocated, unless the match is:

1. postponed (in advance) by mutual agreement of the league teams involved, and then only with the prior approval of the League Secretary.
2. officially postponed (see Bye Law B5)
3. unable to be played due to special circumstances prevailing. Special circumstances shall be determined as such by the League Secretary and will only be invoked in situations beyond the control of the teams concerned - this does not include holidays, other engagements, etc. Examples of 'special circumstances' could be 'adverse weather conditions', 'power and/or heating failures', 'illness / bereavement' etc. The League Secretary may decide to treat the match as 'postponed, to be re-arranged',

or may declare the match as 'cancelled' with no penalty to either teams involved.

At least 8 minutes prior to the start of each league match both teams must collect their scorecards from the green steward at the reception desk. The scorecard will only be provided by the green steward on full payment of the rink fees. Note that a depleted team (see bye law B9) must still pay the full rink fees.

In the event of a 'no-show' by a team, the captain of the defaulting team will be billed for the total rink fee (for both teams) and the opposing team will be awarded a 10-0 win (and 2 points). The non-defaulting team must inform the League Secretary that the match was not played by writing on the scorecard the names of the team members that arrived for the match and a note stating that their opponents failed to turn up. The card must then be placed in the result card slot for that league.

In the event of both teams defaulting, the captain of each team will be billed for their own rink fees (no result will be recorded, and the match treated as unplayed). However, if both league team captains agree, subject to approval of the League Secretary, the match may be treated as postponed, and re-arranged as defined below, except that a 'Postponed League Match' form must be completed and returned to the League Secretary, no more than 5 days after the date of the original game.

A league match that is to be postponed must be re-arranged, to be played before the end of the season, by the two league team captains concerned. A 'Postponed League Match' form (available from the box containing the blank Additional Players Registration forms) must be completed and returned to the League Secretary, prior to the date of the original game. This must show the new date and time agreed for the match (which must also be booked and confirmed in the Rink Booking Sheets folder (in accordance with bye-law A6). Failure to play a postponed match will result in both captains being billed for the rink fees.

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

B5 Official Postponement

A league match may be postponed where the rink is required for official club matches or national / county / other external competitions. See bye-law A7.

Team captains must be given at least 72 hours notice of any alterations to the playing schedule.

B6 Team Playing Constitutions

- Mixed leagues: at least one member of the opposite sex.
- Open leagues: any combination.
- Men's leagues: men only.
- Ladies leagues: ladies only.

Failure to abide by these regulations will result in the offending team being treated as a 'no-show', and bye-law B4 will apply.

B7 Two Hour League Matches

These matches shall be a maximum of 2 hours duration.

- Pairs: shall be a maximum of 18 ends.
- Triples: shall be a maximum of 16 ends.
- Fours: shall be a maximum of 18 ends.

2 points will be awarded for a Win, 1 point for a Draw.

The match will not start until the start of session bell rings.

An illegally delivered jack (i.e. which comes to rest outside the confines of the rink) will be 'placed' by the opposing skip, who may also direct where the mat is to be positioned.

If, during the course of an end, the jack is caused to leave the side of the rink, the jack shall be placed on the pre-marked 'spot' on the rink that is on the same side that it left the rink. If a bowl is already on or obscuring the 'spot' the jack will be placed as near as possible to the bowl without touching it, between the 'spot' and the centre of the rink. If any other bowl is in the way, the jack will be placed as near to that without

touching it and the centre of the rink. In other words, directly between the 'spot' and centre line without touching a bowl.

In the event of a 'tied end', i.e. when the nearest bowl of each team is equidistant from the jack, the end shall not be replayed, but entered on the scorecard as having been played without any score indicated to either team.

The 7-minute warning bell will signify that no further end can be started.

An end will be deemed to have started if the jack has been delivered before the warning bell starts ringing. The jack will be deemed to have been delivered the instant it leaves the hand (it does not need to be at rest when the bell starts ringing).

A jack coming to rest illegally after the 7 minute bell has ceasing ringing will be 'placed' by the opposing skip, who may also direct where the mat is be positioned.

An end, once begun, will be played to the finish.

No trial ends will be allowed.

No player will visit the head during the course of a match.

Skips must leave the head together and not return to the head under any circumstances. Other members of the team will not go to the head until all players (except the skips) have delivered all their bowls. The penalty will be one shot deducted from the offending team's score for each offence.

B8 Fixed Number of Ends League Matches

These matches shall be a maximum of 3 hours duration (including trial ends, if played).

2 points will be awarded for a Win, 1 point for a Draw.

The match will not start until the start of session bell rings.

Trial ends will be allowed.

Reasonable visiting the head will be allowed.

When a jack is delivered illegally the Laws of the Sport of Indoor Bowls will be applied.

If, during the course of an end, the jack is caused to leave the side of the rink, the jack shall be placed on the pre-marked

‘spot’ on the rink that is on the same side that it left the rink. If the ‘spot’ is already occupied or obscured see B7 for more detailed instructions.

B9 Late Arrival, Depleted Teams and Retirements

A late arrival in a fours match may start play at the 2nd or 3rd end and a normal game played (provided that both leads and seconds have bowled the regulation number of woods each in the 1st, and where applicable, 2nd ends).

In a depleted fours match (i.e. three players only), leads and seconds should use 3 woods each and the skip 2 woods. The team (or teams) of three will forfeit 25% of their total score. If a team plays with three players on more than three occasions the forfeit will be increased to 40% of their total score for all the depleted fours matches that they play thereafter. These adjustments shall be calculated exactly by the League Secretary. For example, if a team of three has scored 13 shots at the end of a match and they have previously played two matches with only three players, 25% will be deducted from the score of 13 resulting in a final match score of 9.75 shots. However, if a team of three has scored 16 shots at the end of a match and they have previously played three or more matches with only three players, 40% will be deducted from the 16 resulting in a final match score of 9.6 shots.

In a depleted triples match (i.e. two players only), leads and skips should use 4 woods each. The team of three playing in a depleted triples match shall play as a normal triple (i.e. each player shall use 3 woods each). As for all other league matches, the team that wins an end shall take the mat and deliver the jack on the next end. However, the team of three players shall always play the first wood following delivery of the jack, regardless of the team that has delivered the jack. They will, therefore also be the last to play in any end, playing their ninth wood after the eighth and final wood of the opposing team of two has been played. This will ensure alternate bowls are played throughout the game. The team of two players will have to manage their changeover positions accordingly. The team (or teams) of two will forfeit 25% of

their total score. If a team plays with two players on more than three occasions the forfeit will be increased to 40% of their total score for all the depleted triples matches that they play thereafter. These adjustments shall be calculated exactly by the League Secretary. Examples of these calculations are as for a depleted fours game, shown above.

Depleted teams (fours or triples) must still abide by the league playing constitution (e.g. if a mixed league, one of the team actually bowling must be of the opposite sex to other team members also bowling), otherwise bye-law B6 applies.

The non attendance of one player in a pair, or two or more players in a triple or a four, will count as a 'no-show' and bye-law B4 will apply.

If, during a match, one member of a 'triples' or 'fours' team 'retires', on medical grounds, the match may be completed by the remaining members of the team without penalty provided that the remaining members of team continue to bowl with the same number of bowls each. Alternatively, the remaining members of the team may opt to play as a depleted triple or four, in which case they will forfeit 25% of their total score.

B9 Promotions and Relegations

At the end of the season, for two division leagues, the bottom two teams in the upper division will normally be relegated, and the top two teams in the lower division will normally be promoted. Changes to the league structure for the following season may make this impractical, and this procedure may be varied at the League Secretary's discretion.

B10 Withdrawals

In the event of any team withdrawing from a league during the season, the League Secretary shall have discretion over filling the vacancy.

Should a team not be replaced, all results recorded against that team will be discounted in compiling the league table.

C1 Club Competition Entries

Means of entry to Club Competitions shall be by submission of the appropriate entry form, together with entry fees, before the closing date stated on the form.

Entry forms will be available at the start of each season, and will show the dates and times for the Club Competition Semi-finals and Finals. In signing and submitting the entry form, competitors are agreeing that they and their team will abide by these bye-laws and observe the following conditions of entry:

1. Members may not enter/participate in CDIBC competitions if they have entered or subsequently take part in club competitions at another Indoor Bowling Club in the same season, where participation in those competitions would conflict with the CDIBC ***Semi-finals and Finals*** Dates.
2. Competitors who become eligible to enter any External Competition by virtue of success in a competition at CDIBC will represent the Club in that competition, should they choose to enter it.
3. Competitors agree that they and their team, will be available to play on the dates/times selected by the Competition Secretary for the Club Competition ***Semi-Finals and Finals*** should they reach this stage.
4. The Novice Pairs competition is open only to those bowlers with 3 years or less indoor and/or outdoor bowling experience and who have not reached a final in an indoor club competition.
5. The Ladies Novice Singles competition is open only to those lady bowlers who have not reached a final in an indoor club competition.

The Bowling Committee may at its discretion disqualify competitors from current and future competitions for non-observance of these conditions.

Following the closing date for entries the draws for all competitions will take place.

A minimum of 8 entries are required for each competition. In the event that there are less than 8 entries for a competition, the Bowling Committee will decide whether or not the competition should be run. If the Bowling Committee decides that the competition should not be run, the entry fees for that competition will be refunded.

Progress sheets detailing the draws, the closing dates for each round (see C5 below) and updated results will be posted on the Competitions notice board at intervals during the season.

C2 Rounds up to the Semi-Finals

Competitions shall be played as follows.

- Singles: First to 21 shots - always played to the finish.
- Pairs: 21 ends, or four hours, whichever is the shorter.
- Triples: 18 ends, or four hours, whichever is the shorter
- Fours: 21 ends, or four hours, whichever is the shorter.
- 2 Wood Pairs: See below for special rules for this event.
- Novice Pairs: See below for special rules for this event.

C3 Playing Conventions

Matches subject to the four hour session rule: two trial ends and visiting the head are allowed. If after the required number of ends have been played the scores are level an extra end shall be played if this can be done within the four hour time limit. If it cannot, and for any match subject to this rule, where after four hours the scores are level, the winners will be decided on number of ends won. If both sides have won an equal number of ends the side winning the last completed end will be deemed the winners.

Singles matches: the first to reach 21 shots is the winner. If the match is not completed within a 2 hour session, it may only be continued if the rink is free for the following session, otherwise it must be continued on a different (free) rink or at some other time to be agreed by the players concerned. No visiting the head is permitted until both players have played at least 2 bowls each. The penalty will be one shot deducted from

the offending player's score for each infringement of this rule. All 'dead ends' to be re-played.

2 wood pairs: rounds up to the semi-finals shall be the best of 3 sets of 7 ends each, subject to an overall two hours' maximum time limit. Matches should be played in a designated club two-hour session.

Teams shall toss a coin for right to deliver jack at start of first set, then alternate for subsequent sets. In the event a match goes to a deciding set (i.e. the deciding set is the third set in matches prior to the semi-finals or the fifth set in the case of the semi-finals and finals) teams shall toss a coin for the right to deliver the jack at the start of this set.

No trial ends are permitted in rounds up to the semi-finals. Dead ends are to be re-played.

In rounds prior to the semi-finals visiting the head is not permitted and skips must leave the head together in these rounds.

Each set shall be played to determine a winner so that where a set is tied after seven ends an extra end (or ends in the event of a dead end or tied end) shall be played. Where time does not permit a set to be completed the score standing at the completion of the last end, i.e. the end during which the seven-minute bell sounded, shall count as the score for that set. In the event the match is tied the winner of the greatest number of ends overall in the match shall be the winner. If this still leaves the match tied the winner will be the winner of the last end played.

The semi-finals and final shall be the best of 5 sets of 7 ends.

Novice pairs: rounds up to the semi-finals shall be played under the rules for a two hour **league match** as per bye-law B7.

In the event the match is tied the winner of the most number of ends overall in the match shall be the winner. If this still leaves the match tied the winner will be the winner of the last end played.

Semi-finals and Finals shall be played subject to the rules for

a normal pairs competition match as per bye-law C2 above.

C4 Rules for Constitution of Teams

A mixed fours team shall consist of two ladies and two gentlemen.

In pairs, triples and fours, players taking part in the first game constitute the team. One substitute may be used in succeeding rounds provided that he/she has not already entered the competition. In this context 'entered' is taken to mean: has played in an earlier round or has been named in the draw.

In mixed competitions, two substitutes, one of each sex, are permitted, but only one substitute per round may be used. If a substitute, or substitutes, is/are required for more than one round, the same substitute(s) shall be used.

Rules where a match cannot be played:

If a team cannot, allowing for the use of a substitute, fulfil a match either in the current or a future round of a competition, it must withdraw from the competition immediately, and the team captain shall notify this to his or her opponents and the Competition Secretary.

Non-attendance of one or more players in a team in any match which has been confirmed in the rink diary (and not previously cancelled), will result in the game being forfeited by the offending player/team. The defaulting player or team will pay the total rink fee (for both teams). In the event of non-attendance by one or more players in both teams, each team will pay their own rink fees.

C5 Closing Dates

The Closing Dates for the rounds of each Competition up to the *semi-finals* will be posted by the Competition Secretary once the competition draw has been completed. No extension will be granted beyond the closing dates of the rounds without the agreement of the Competition Secretary. Matches may only be played later than the posted date if the rink booked for the match is taken by a national or other senior competition, or at discretion of Competition Secretary. If a competitor is awarded a walkover by his or her opposition, the Competition

Secretary must be notified accordingly on or before the closing date of the round. Failure to play a match on or before the closing date of the round may result in the elimination of both competitors from that competition.

C6 Procedures For Rounds up to the Final.

The Challenger i.e. the first named player on the draw sheet must offer his or her opponent the choice of two dates (one of which must be at a weekend). For the first round, these dates are to be not less than 14 days before the closing date of that round, and where it is a second or subsequent round, the offer of dates must be made within 8 days of the closing date of the previous round. In the event the challenger defaults on this procedure the second named player then becomes the challenger and shall offer any two dates before the closing date of the round.

Note: For rounds up to the *semi-finals* the challenger will be responsible for providing the marker.

For rink booking procedures see bye-law A7 above.

C7 Semi-Finals and Finals

Semi-Finals and Finals are played in 'whites' (see bye-law A4), except for the Novice competitions which are played in 'greys'.

Two trial ends are allowed as is visiting the head at any time.

All matches are subject to the four hour rule.

Two Wood Pairs matches to be best of 5 sets of 7 ends.

The Novice Pairs will be played as a normal pairs competition, i.e. to 21 ends.

The Club will arrange markers for singles *semi-finals and finals*.

All *semi-finals and finals* will have an Umpire or Competent Person appointed by the Competition Secretary.

Note: Semi-Final dates are reserved in Fixture List, but, at time of going to press, not yet allocated to specific competitions.

They will be allocated later and shown on Competition Entry Forms. At that time, they will also be shown in the Electronic Rink Management System, and on Fixture List on website.

NOTES FOR LEAGUE TEAM CAPTAINS

Things to do . . .

Registration of Teams

Register your team - whether existing or new - in the Captains' Signing-On Book held in Reception. The deadlines for signing up your teams are shown on the front covers of the summer and winter books and reminders are posted on the club notice boards.

Recruitment of Players

There is a folder at Reception which lists the names of players looking for teams and in which team captains looking for players can enter their requirements. Talk to other players and other captains who very often know if either is looking for more players.

Fixtures for the Season

The season's league fixtures are normally sent to winter captains during August and to summer captains in early March. Included with these league fixtures is a registration form, asking for the membership number and names of the players within your team. The registration form has to be returned to the League Secretary together with the registration fee for each team. The current fee and return date are shown on the form.

Please note that additional players can be registered at any time during the season.

Selection for Matches

There are pro-forma league sheets which show the days and dates on which matches are played and room in which to enter your teams details as required. Captains use these sheets to inform players of their selection. Should you need any help please do not hesitate to ask.

Electronic versions of these sheets, one for each day of the week, with all the match dates pre-formatted, are also available – these forms may be downloaded from the club's website www.cdibc.co.uk.

Who Pays for What?

Registration Fee: The captain collects the required amount from each of his players having already paid for the team's registration

earlier.

Rink fees: Each player pays their own green fee, usually to the skip or player who has 'bought the card' for their team prior to the start of their match.

Fines:

Whilst the captain is responsible to the club for paying any due fines, it is the team's responsibility to ensure the captain is not out of pocket and to come to an agreement as to how to deal with this matter. Bye-law A5 applies to the team as a whole,

COACHING

Coaching School

The school has a coaching staff of some 25 coaches who are trained to give instruction at different levels. The coaches will provide basic instruction for beginners, run improver's classes and give individual clinics for experienced bowlers as requested.

Training courses for beginners

Courses of 4 two-hour sessions are run on Saturday mornings from 10am to 12pm and may be arranged at other times to suit pupil's requirements depending on availability of rinks. By the end of the course the pupil should be proficient enough to participate in the club bowling activities, including the club's 'friendly' matches.

Improver Training

Courses of 2 two-hour sessions are run at convenient times during the season to suit the pupils. The course includes a video session followed by an improvement clinic. The second session includes practice techniques to improve obtaining line and length and exercises in reading a head.

Dress Code

The club's dress code is relaxed for coaching school pupils under instruction, whereby smart casual clothing may be worn during the training sessions. This also applies to novice bowlers having 'roll-up' sessions and is intended to encourage new bowlers to participate more fully in the game in their initial few weeks in the club, perhaps whilst deciding whether the game is for them or not!

Coaching training

The coaching school trains coaches for the local outdoor clubs. Full instruction is given to qualify a coach, and advice and support is then offered to the coach in their outdoor club, particularly in the training of new bowlers

Skills Seminars

Throughout the summer Surrey County coaching teams will visit an outdoor club and run a skills seminar consisting of a day of coaching and practice for the club members. Camberley coaches support these activities and the coaching school will arrange a seminar for a local club on request.

CAMBERLEY CRUSADERS JUNIOR SECTION

The Camberley Crusaders is the U/18 Youth Section of Camberley & District Indoor Bowling Club. The section was first formed in the Season 2000-01 when a small group of members' children/grandchildren were allocated a free training period on Saturday mornings from 08:30 – 10:00 a.m.

Since those early days the numbers have gone up and down, but with help from parents and grandparents we are keeping the section going well.

Saturday morning is still the main training session when we are available for roll-ups from 8:00, then at 8:30 we start training and coaching. We then finish off with a rink game until 10:00. By then some of the young people sit down to a cooked breakfast at a reasonable rate.

Coaching is a very important part of the training, and when capable of playing with the adults, their membership allows the youth to enjoy some of the facilities of the club at a reduced rate.

The Crusaders run their own internal competitions that include U12, U15 and U18 singles championships, and the finals take place on the Saturday morning of the Club Finals weekend.

What's going on?

Most new or inexperienced bowlers joining Camberley and District Indoor Bowling Club without a guide or mentor must have wondered, from time to time, what it's all about. Surely bowls is all about getting on the green and bowling up one's woods. Well yes - but no!

Very soon it becomes obvious that 'getting on the green' involves a little bit more. These notes seek to offer some help to any club member wanting to become involved.

Firstly then, an explanation of which bowls events can be found to be taking place, and when. Lets break it down into component parts:

Leagues

Most operate as a single division only, others have two divisions with promotion and relegation. Each league (or division of a league) is composed of 6 or more teams, each run by a self appointed team captain. Each team must have a minimum number of players (as defined in the club bye-laws). Leagues are played from Monday opening at 10.00am through to Friday at 10.00pm, with the exception of Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons (see friendly matches below).

A Novice Fun Drive takes place on Sunday evenings from 6.30 pm until 8.30 pm although bowlers should arrive around 6 pm. The first session will be on Sunday 7th October. The fun drive is designed for new bowlers and those who consider that they fit well into the novice category. We look forward to seeing those that took part last year and new novice bowlers to the club. Have a good season, enjoy yourselves.

Friendly Matches

These are generally played against other Clubs (Indoor and Outdoor) or Bowling Associations. Lists are displayed in the foyer of the club and (within the format of the match) are there for any member of the club to append his or her name to indicate their availability for match selection.

Generally, but not exclusively, Tuesday matches are for ladies, Wednesdays for men - however both days offer a number of mixed

matches. Weekend games on Saturday and Sunday afternoons vary in format, but are mostly mixed. Afternoon matches are of 18 or 21 ends duration (depending on whether teams are made up of triples or rinks (i.e. 3 or 4 bowlers) and usually played in 'whites'. Occasionally, matches are arranged as 'in-house' games, e.g. Ladies v Gentlemen. A summary of all friendly fixtures appears earlier in this booklet.

Competitions

Here matters become more complex, as there is considerable variety in the type and number of competitions that may be entered. Let's try to unravel the complexity:

Club Competitions

These are open to all members, who can enter any (or all), as appropriate, of singles, pairs, triples or rinks (i.e. fours) for ladies or men.

In order to encourage more Ladies to enter competitions it was decided last year to replace the Ladies Pairs, Ladies Triples and Ladies Fours with drawn competitions where teams would be drawn from the pool of entrants. For the Ladies Triples and Ladies Fours the skips would be seeded and drawn separately. This is anticipated to continue this year.

There are mixed pairs and rinks for both ladies and men to enter together, as well as an 'over 60's' singles, and a '2-wood' pairs, which are 'open' competitions.

There is also a 'Novice Pairs' competition, open only to members that have played bowls (indoor and/or outdoor) for three years or less and a Ladies Novice Singles open to any lady that has not previously reached a club competition final.

All club competitions are played on a 'knock-out' basis.

Following the Men's and Ladies Championship Singles Finals, the winners will be invited to play in a Champion of Champions final to determine the overall Club Champion.

County Competitions - Men

In accordance with Surrey County Indoor Bowling Association (SCIBA) rules, the club enter the previous year's winners, runners-up and semi-finalists of the club men's singles, men's pairs and

men's triples championships to the equivalent county championships for the next season. The club singles champion is also entered for the national champion of champions competitions.

The club also enters 3 teams into the London & Southern Counties Bowling Association's Indoor Fours Championship.

Other Surrey County competitions include over 60's men's singles, men's fours, mixed pairs and mixed fours, which are open to all club members who wish to enter as an appropriately structured team.

County Competitions - Ladies

Ladies county competitions available are Pairs, Triples, Rinks (Fours), Under 50 singles and Over 50's singles. See the Surrey County Women's Indoor Bowling Association (SCWIBA) handbook for details (a club copy is available for inspection, by the correspondence pigeon holes, located in the entrance hall).

National Competitions

Usually entered by individual members who 'fancy their chances' as bowlers, and want to bowl at a higher level. Good quality bowling offering opportunities to play away at other clubs, where the draw permits, with the eventual aim at appearing at national finals. Very challenging, especially arranging times and venues!

County, Regional and National Inter-Club Competitions

Teams for these competitions are selected by the Team Manager to represent the club. Again the matches, and their play by/on dates (where available at publication time) are shown in this booklet.

Roll-Ups

These are a long-standing part of the bowls world. Although no rink space has been scheduled for roll-ups, there are rinks available during a number of league sessions which can be used for this purpose. An early morning session is available for roll-ups on weekdays from 8:30 am until morning leagues commence. This session is free of charge, although at other times, a rink fee is payable. Keep an eye on the rink book at Reception, or the Electronic Booking System available on-line via the club website (<http://cdibc.co.uk>). The club also runs 'fun drives' on days where there are no matches. Players play in teams, which 'swap'

about every four ends. The object is to be the bowler with greatest number of shots scored during the overall game.

Tournaments

Various tournaments, generally restricted to club members only, have been run very successfully in the past, both at the New year and Easter (Good Friday). These are usually whole day affairs, played by up to 24 teams on a mini-league basis, followed by semi-finals and finals between the winners of the mini-leagues. Watch the notice board for details, these days are very enjoyable.

Summary

That's the bowling activity within the club - and, of course, you are saying "How do I fit in?". In short the answer is to help yourself, but a few comments may help - let's look at each section separately:

Leagues:

There is a book at the Reception Desk in which you can show that you are available to join a league - enter appropriate details of name, telephone number, membership number, and when you are available to play. There is also a section in the book for league team captains to advertise for additional players to join their teams: it is up to you to look in this book and proceed from there.

You may join any number of teams but, of course, can play for only one team in any league. If you want to form your own team, you may do so at the end of the season, when the league programme is being scheduled for the following year. The League Secretary will place a book at Reception for all existing captains to confirm their entries, and for new teams to register where there are vacancies in the league structure. Help and Advice is available if you want to understand how to run a team – just ask any committee member.

Friendly Matches:

Don't be worried about joining in here. This is the place to learn what bowling is all about. Put your name down on the availability sheets. Make sure you get to know the Captain of the day, and enjoy your game.

Club Competitions:

These are open to all members. Please note that these matches are played on a "knock-out" basis.

Competition Entry Forms are produced each year (usually in September/October) detailing all Individual Club Competitions that may be entered, which should be completed and returned (together with appropriate Entry Fees) to the Competition Secretary, by the date stated on the form for play in the same Season

County and National competitions:

County singles, pairs and triples (men only) can only be entered by reaching the semi-finals of the club singles, pairs and/or triples competitions. Other county competitions are open to all.

For ladies, there are Under 50 Singles, Over 50s Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours county competitions open to all lady members who wish to enter either singly or as a team.

All national competitions are open to all members.

Competition Entry Forms are produced each year (usually in February) detailing all Individual County and National Competitions that may be entered which should be completed and returned (together with appropriate Entry Fees) to the Competition Secretary, by the date stated on the form for play in the following Season

Inter-Club Competitions:

It is unlikely that new or inexperienced bowlers would be selected for these highly competitive Inter-Club Competitions (e.g. Denny Cup, Yetton Trophy etc). Nevertheless the dates and venues for these matches are published in this book, and any support that you can give would be very welcome, and much appreciated by the members selected to play.

Roll-Ups and Club Drives:

An excellent way of measuring your abilities against other members, as well as improving your bowling. More importantly, perhaps, a chance to get to know other members. Roll-ups and club drives are also very good fun - do join in!

Coaching

There are excellent coaching facilities available at the club. Please read the section under COACHING for more information.
